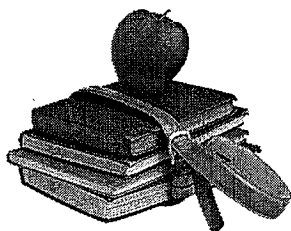

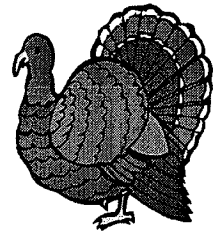

## Scoliosis Screening

In the next month, the Lynd School Nurse will be conducting the scoliosis screening for the 5th & 6th grade girls. Scoliosis is an abnormal curvature of the spine. The screening is simple and consists of a 30 second test in which the school nurse looks at the child's back while in standing position and in a forward bending position.

## Immunizations

In accordance with the School Immunization Law (Minnesota Statutes, Section 121A.15), students may not enroll or remain enrolled in school without having provided either documentation of immunizations against certain vaccine-preventable diseases or appropriate medical or conscientious exemptions. The Lynd School requires this documentation to be up to date and given to the school by October 28, 2011.

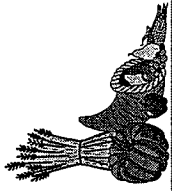



My hobbies include playing softball, exercising, traveling, reading, and creating fun activities for students. I am interested in coaching a sports team some day.

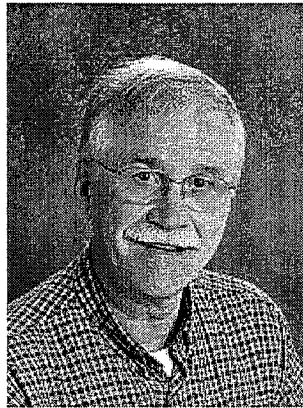
